

# Civics and Government

Session 4 2021-2022

Tuesday 9:00-10:30

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Description: This course will improve students' civic knowledge, civic attitudes, and core literacy skills. Students will learn how our political systems work and will use that knowledge to address real-world issues. Students will grow more informed and curious about being engaged in government. They may step into the role of a Supreme Court or Federal judge, a member of Congress, a community activist, or even a President– and do the job they do. Students gain civic knowledge and skills in a learning experience that is both fun and challenging.

Expectations: In-class participation through discussion and activities is expected. Students must be respectful of other opinions. There will be occasional homework, about 30 minutes per week.
